


A new day is an opportunity to make a new connection!

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Monday is Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. Take time to pause and reflect on his impact. Read more about the history of this holiday here (from USA Today).


National Compliment Day is Friday! Did you know that this day started in my home state of New Hampshire? Read more about it here!
